

What is an oral proficiency interview?

It is an assessment of your speaking proficiency. An interview is different than a test because it tests interpersonal listening in addition to interpersonal speaking (not just presentation speaking like in a recording).

What is it on?

OPI's are typically pretty free topics. I will start by asking a few basic warm-up questions (Spanish 1 material). If you can lead the conversation from there we will talk about what you want to talk about. If not, I will eventually bring us back to the theme of the unit we are studying. I will post what I expect you to do for that unit below:

- ✓ I can have a simple conversation about why people wear what they wear.
- ✓ I can talk to someone about what to wear in order to be part of a group.
- ✓ I can ask and answer questions related to fashion.

Where do I sign up?

There will be consequences for deleting what others have entered.

What if I don't sign up?

On the day of the test, I will interrupt your writing test to have the oral interview with you in the lab.

Sweet, so why sign up?

There's not enough time to do this with all students, so if I don't have time to get to you in class that day, then you have to come before school within 1 week of the test date and use a late pass to do the interview.

Fine, I'll sign up, but what if I don't show to my appointment?

If you sign up for an interview and don't show, you must use a late-pass to take it later (before school within 1 week of the test date).

Reasons to do it outside of class

- More time for me to be patient and assist you during the interview
- The rest of the class won't hear your interview with me
- More time to work on the other sections of the test in the lab

Reasons to do it in-class

- So you don't have to come before or after school or during lunch
- More time to study (*if you were going to anyway*)
